


#### Noël Wan - Harp Saturday, October 14, 2023

Lauded as "a huge talent [with] hidden power and amazing maturity" (Bart van Oort), Taiwanese-American harpist Dr. **Noël Wan** made her international debut in 2010 performing Alberto Ginastera's Harp Concerto with the Utrecht Symphony Orchestra. She can be heard on her debut solo album The Secret Garden (2010); with the Illinois Modern Ensemble on Dmitri Tymoczko's album Fools and Angels (2018, Panoramic/New Focus); and forthcoming recordings of Tymoczko's Lead Sheet (2019) and John Liberatore's Hold Back Thy Hours (2012).

As a scholar and educator, Dr. Wan explores imaginative intersections between the harp, identity, and spaces. Her recent projects include: affect and the environment in the music of Toru Takemitsu and Zhou Long; new materialism and feminist phenomenology in Georges Aperghis' Fidélité (1982); and narratives of Blackness and love in Leo Brouwer's El decamerón negro (1981). As a writer, she has contributed to Harp Column, The American Harp Journal, and The Collective, addressing topics of performance practice, music education, philosophy, feminism, and race.

Dr. Wan is an alumna of the University of Illinois (BM, DMA)—where she was a 2016-2019 Illinois Distinguished Fellow—and the Yale School of Music (MM). Born in the San Francisco Bay Area, Dr. Wan has since called many other places "home"— Illinois, Connecticut, the Netherlands, and Taiwan. She currently lives in Kitchener, Ontario with her husband, conductor/composer Patrick Murray, and their loquacious tuxedo cat Georgina.

Stick & Bow, "The trailblazing Montreal duo that plays everything from Bach to Radiohead" (CBC Music' The Intro), unites Canadian marimba player Krystina Marcoux and Argentinian cellist Juan Sebastian Delgado. Classically trained musicians, they strive to present a wide spectrum of musical styles, ranging from rock to gypsy-jazz, baroque or tango. Their eclectic repertoire features original arrangements of some of the most celebrated works in history, showing the potential of their instruments combined. In their creative process, they combine musical narration with humor and story-telling in which the powerful combination of cello & marimba transforms the listening of familiar works in refreshing and unexpected ways. Stick & Bow is also strongly committed to the music of our time, commissioning works that are daring yet accessible from composers Luis Naon, Camille Pépin, Luna Pearl Woolf, Jason Noble, Marcelo Nisinman, Jean-Pierre Drouet and more.

Stick & Bow's critically-acclaimed debut album Resonance is praised by Toronto's The WholeNote as "just brilliant" & "totally delightful" and by La Scena Musicale as full of "pleasant surprises."






# **Duo Cordelia,** violin and piano Friday, February 16, 2024

Formed in 2016, Duo Cordelia features violinist and composer **Vanessa Marcoux** and pianist **Marie-Christine Poirier**. The ensemble is very active on the Canadian classical music scene and is being regularly invited to perform both in Quebec and British Columbia. The two musicians widen the framework of their respective instruments by ushering them into new territory. The Duo's mission is to expand the possibilities within the medium of the classical concert by introducing improvisation, an array of exciting repertoire from the 20th and 21st century, arrangements of traditional melodies and original compositions by Vanessa. This rich combination of classical repertoire and lesser-known works allows the listener to draw new bridges between musical universes that would otherwise be dissociated. The result is a touching and unique concert experience, which goes straight to the heart of our deep connection with music.

The Duo has received numerous grants from the Quebec and Canada Arts Councils, and is currently working on its first album, which will be released in 2023.

## Back Alley Big Band Saturday, April 27, 2024

The Back Alley Big Band is a contemporary jazz ensemble that features the best jazz musicians in Eastern Canada. This group of seasoned professionals is dedicated to playing big band jazz in both modern and traditional big band jazz styles. The material ranges from the wonderful jazz ensemble classics of legend Sammy Nestico to modern day big band charts by Bob Curnow's L.A. Big Band and Gordon Goodwin's Big Phat Band and also with original compositions written by Lead Alto Saxophonist Mr. Chris Mitchell.

The instrumentation is in the big band tradition - five Saxes, four Trumpets, four Trombones, and Rhythm Section – Piano, Guitar, Bass and Drums - often augmented by the addition of Latin percussionists – congas and timbales. Vocalists are also a feature of this group - Cuban singing sensation Augusto Enriquez with his exciting Latin material and Nova Scotian singer Doris Mason with her Ella Fitzgerald and Natalie Cole stylings. This group has twice been featured at the Atlantic Jazz Festival – the first time in 2009 opening for The Preservation Hall Jazz Band from New Orleans and two times backing Augusto Enriquez.

In 2015 the Back Alley Big Band traveled to Havana, Cuba to perform at the Karl Marx Theatre with Augusto as part of the prestigious Leo Brouwer Festival and again in 2016 in Ottawa at a special performance for the House of Commons and the House of Senate. This band will knock your socks off as they enthusiastically delight audiences with their solid ensemble and improvisational skills.
